L Shape Rein Back (Style obstacle)

Objectives

The horse and rider enter the obstacle by riding between the poles until the front feet are over the furthest (start) line. They then rein back for the length of the rein back zone ie until the horse's front feet are behind the (finish) line. The poles will form an L shape


Effectiveness faults

Judging will commence when the front feet are over the start line and finish when both front feet are behind the finish line

- Running out or circling before entering the obstacle
- Refusal including stepping back
- Touching poles
- Break in forward motion

Style evaluation

- Regular backward motion
- Good rider position
- Horse and rider maintain balance at all time
- Calmness and obedience of the horse
- Discreet rider aids



Orienteering (Style obstacle)

Navigate the obstacle one handed forming equal circles around each compass point at walk

Objectives

Enter between from the south (between the red and white flags)

Circle around east on the right rein

Circle around north on the left rein

Circle around west on the right rein

Exit through the south flags


To show the appropriateness of the rider's aids and obedience of the horse. The obstacle is complete once the horse tail is clear of the south exit flags.

Effectiveness faults

- Running out or circling before entering the obstacle
- Refusal including stepping back
- Touching a post
- Change of gait including break in forward motion
- Putting both hands on the reins or swapping hands = 0
- Orienteering the circles in the incorrect order = 0

Style evaluation

- Regular forward motion
- Good rider position
- Horse and rider maintain balance at all time
- Well shaped circles
- Discreet rider aids



The Pear Drop (gait obstacle)

Objectives

To show the appropriateness of the rider's aids and obedience of the horse The horse must be stationary for the rider to ring the bell to start and finish Pick up your chosen gait between the markers.

Ride and maintain chosen pace around the marked corridor

Pace must be maintained until rear legs are clear of the finish markers

The obstacle can be ridden in either direction

Novice & Newcomers – 2 handed

All other classes - 1 handed

Effectiveness faults

Change of gait/break in forward motion


Running out or circling before the obstacle

Refusal including stepping back

Not ringing the bell to start/finish = 0

Riding out of the marked corridor = 0
